Hepatitis update you should know:

WHO urges action on hepatitis, announcing hepatitis D as carcinogenic

The International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC), affiliated with the World Health Organization (WHO), has officially classified hepatitis D virus (HDV) as carcinogenic to humans—aligning it with hepatitis B and C in terms of cancer risk.

Hepatitis D: A Silent but Potent Threat

Hepatitis D can only infect those who already carry hepatitis B, but in these individuals, it rapidly accelerates liver damage and dramatically increases the risk of cancer. “This moment should catalyse faster and wider adoption of hepatitis vaccinations and access to care,” said Dr Elisabeth Wild, IARC Director, in an official statement.

Gujarat receives Three award for organ retrieval



Since starting its organ retrieval activities, NCH Surat has facilitated 72 organ donations, benefiting 250 patients across the country. Donations from the hospital included 26 eyes, 57 livers, 126 kidneys, nine pairs of hands, six hearts, 12 lungs, two pancreases, six small bowels and one radial forearm flap (RAFF).

The award was received by a team representing the hospital, including medical superintendent Dr Dharitri Parmar, RMO Dr Ketan Nayak, neurosurgeon Dr Mehul Modi and VP of Gujarat Nursing Council Iqbal Kadiwala. Chief minister Bhupendra Patel congratulated the hospital team in person at Garvi Gujarat Bhavan in New Delhi, lauding their humanitarian efforts and national recognition.


Sub:-Nurse Registration & Tracking System (NRTS) finds its place in State of World Nursing (SOWN) 2025 Report by WHO - reg.

State of the World's Nursing (SOWN) 2025 report provides the most comprehensive and up-to-date analysis of the nursing workforce of the world. The report features new indicators on critical area for nursing, such as education capacity, advance practising nursing and remuneration. There are five additional policy priorities and the compilation of data from each WHO region. The report provides up-to-date valid data and evidence on the global nursing work force, as reported through standardized approach improves data availability. SOWN-2025 report is available at (link:- <https://indiannursingcouncil.org/uploads/pdf/175041085738937483268552669e31be.pdf>). It further says a Unique Nurse Identifier (UNI) system can be helpful in health workforce planning and management by tracking nurse licensure, specialization and deployment across regions. It enables real-time monitoring of available staff, helping authorities quickly reassign resources during public health emergencies.

Based on the above approach i.e valid data, evidence and Unique identifier WHO has found the Nurses Registration and Tracking System (NRTS) as one of the Live Register data concerning to Nurses in India.

Accordingly the NRTS finds its place in the SOWN 2025 Report in the chapter 7 "Services Delivery" page 69 box 7.2 under Unique Nursing Identity System.

In view of the above as a part of best practices, it is advised to all the Nurses and SNRCs to proactively adopt NRTS to enable and create a Live Nursing workforce in India. As on today 13 lakh no. of nurses are registered under NRTS, further details of NRTS placed at INC website (link: <https://nrtis.indiannursingcouncil.gov.in/login.nic>)

The Nurses & Tracking System (NRTS) has been recognized in the World Health Organization's (WHO) State of the World's Nursing (SOWN) 2025 Report.

This recognition highlights the importance of the NRTS as a system that utilizes a Unique Nurse Identifier (UNI) to assist in health workforce planning and management in India. The NRTS, developed by the Indian Nursing Council (INC) in partnership with the National Informatics Centre (NIC), aims to create a live register of nurses across the country.

WHO recommends injectable lenacapavir for HIV prevention



The World Health Organization (WHO) released today new guidelines recommending the use of injectable lenacapavir (LEN) twice a year as an additional pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) option for HIV prevention, in a landmark policy action that could help reshape the global HIV response. The guidelines are being issued at the 13th International AIDS Society Conference (IAS 2025) on HIV Science, in Kigali, Rwanda.

Global childhood vaccination coverage holds steady, yet over 14 million infants remain unvaccinated - WHO, UNICEF



In 2024, 89% of infants received at least one dose of the diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis (DTP) vaccine, and 85% completed all three doses. Global demand for childhood immunization is strong according to new data from WHO and UNICEF

Indian Nurses In Global Demand, Kerala Leads As Top Contributor



The global healthcare industry is currently experiencing a significant nursing shortage, with Indian nurses, particularly from Kerala, becoming prime candidates for international recruitment. The World Health Organization projects a worldwide nurse deficit of 5.8 million in 2023, with demand expected to rise substantially.

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Nursing World Wide

According to the latest review by the World Health Organization, the worldwide nurse deficit is projected to stand at 5.8 million in 2023, declining only slightly to 4.1 million by 2030—a gap that high-income countries are struggling to fill amid aging populations and insufficient domestic training. Around 70,000–100,000 Indian nurses migrated overseas in the last year, with demand expected to rise 15–30% annually as healthcare systems worldwide, from Germany to the United States, ramp up international hiring.

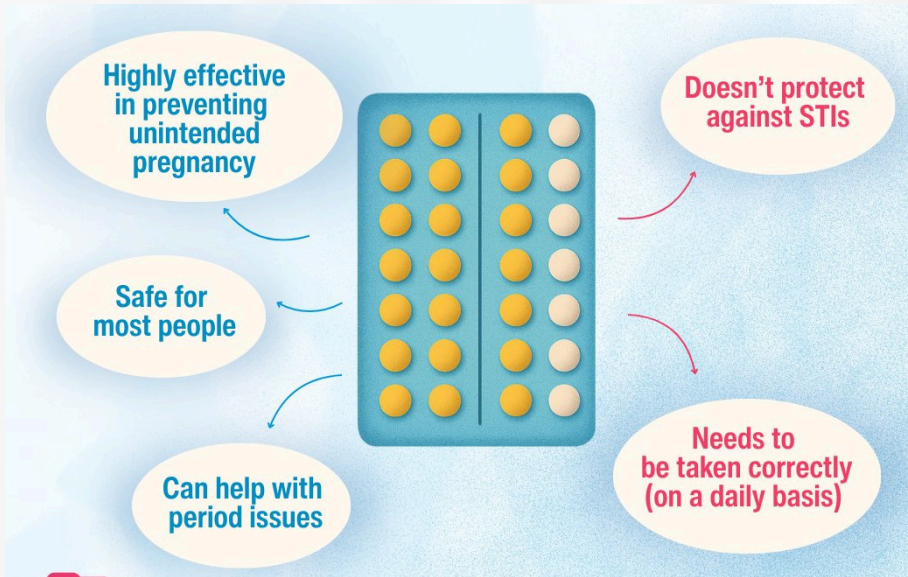

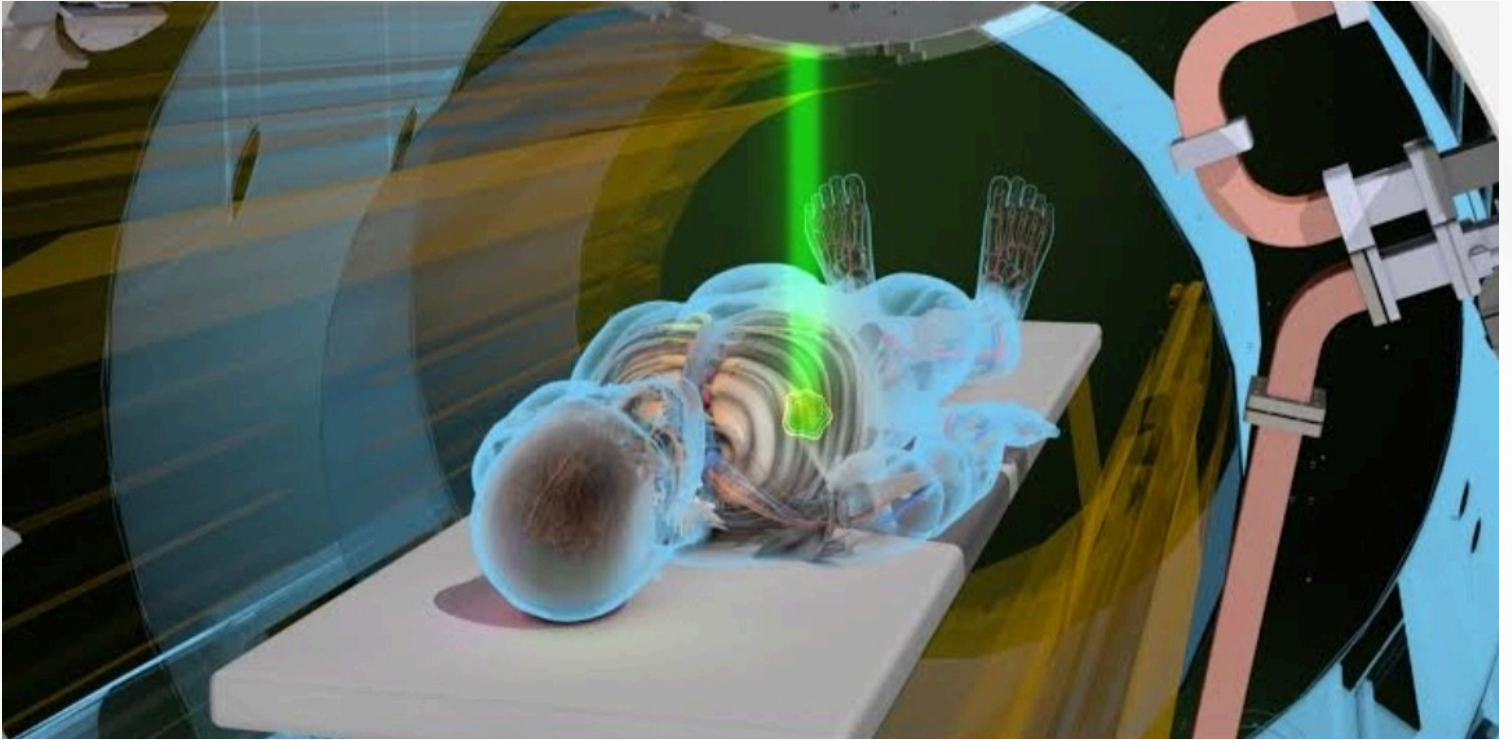

Cancer care - Radiotherapy



Only about half the people in India who need radiotherapy as part of their cancer treatment actually get it, according to a study by the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR). It estimates that on average 58.4 per cent of all cancer patients require radiotherapy, but its actual use is only 28.5 percent. Radiotherapy use is the lowest for patients of lymphoma, lung cancer and prostate cancer.
